### “Life & Death in Iron Age Buckinghamshire” Mike Farley

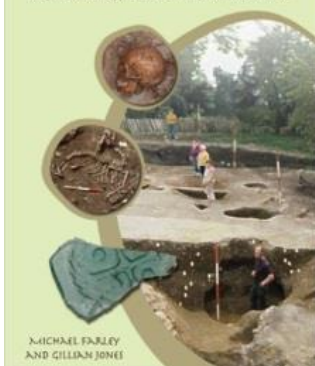
Meeting on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> September, 2015
